



Of the 26 official lodgings that once existed in Kanagawa, this is the last remaining, making it an extremely precious historical resource.







ACCESS

BY TRAIN

From Shinjuku Station catch a JR Chuo Line train. You may need to change trains at Takao Station to continue on to Sagamiko Station. Approx. 60min

From Yokohama Station catch a JR Yokohama Line, Hachioji bound train. Change trains to the JR Chuo Line at Hachioji Station to continue on to Sagamiko Station, Approx. 80 min

lilliku drive on the Chuo Expressway and exit at the Sagamiko East Exit ramp (approx. 60min). Turn left onto Route 20. A further 5 minute drive will take you to the Sagamiko Station intersection lights with Sagamiko Station to your right and Lake Sagami to your left on Route 412


From Yokohama take the Tomei Expressway Yokohama-Machida IC by way of Ebina JCT exiting at Kenou Expressway Sagamihara IC (approx.30min.), then drive on Route 510/Route 412 (approx.30min.)

SAGAMI DAM & LAKE

Sagami Dam was completed in 1947 with the corresponding formation of Lake Sagami becoming the first large scale reservoir in Kanagawa prefecture

It was the venue for canoeing events at the 1964 Tokyo Summer Olympics.

> observing gigantic and unusual rock formations as you make your way up past Kenkyouji Temple to the summit of Mt Sekirou. On clear days Mt Fuji is visible from the summit.

Suitable for beginners & intermediate approx. 4 hrs.

MT MAGO ARA MAIN ST COURSE

This route offers both culture and history at places like Yose Shrine and Obara Inn In the past the patron god of Yose Shrine was venerated for offering protection to lodgers from plagues ravaging through the inns. The patron god was also famous for miraculously helping infants sleep soundly through the night

Suitable for beginners, approx. 2 hrs.

SOKOSAWA COURSE

NTEN BRIDGE Sokosawa is a clear mountain stream in which the legendary Princess Teruta allegedly washed her hair.

> Benten Bridge is a steel suspension bridge popular with tourists and offering magnificent views over the Katsura River. Near the bridge there is a tiny red shrine dedicated to Benten, goddess of water. Suitable for beginners, approx. 2hrs 30mins

The hike from Mt Takao to Mt Shiroyama's 670m summit takes about 1 hour 30 minutes. There, you can enjoy the combined view of Lake Sagami and Mt Fuji



The park is set in a prime location to take in the various surrounding lakeside scenery

On weekends especially, the beautiful views draw crowds of couples, families or drivers wanting to relax before continuing their onward journey.

The lake front shopping promenade located beside the park oozes nostalgia with its retro shooting games and pinball arcade. You can also take a riverboat cruise to fully enjoy Lake Sagami's abundant nature.

Recreational fishing can be enjoyed throughout the year, with Lake Sagami being known for its smelt, black bass and crucian

Lake Sagami during the spring is a wonderful place to observe nature waking up from its winter slumber. The soft greens of the mountains and the spring wild flowers can be enjoyed on the various hiking courses. Escape the city crowds and relax under the Lake Sagami Park cherry trees, or experience the romantic combination of cherry trees and illumination at Pleasure Forest.

From mid to late November is the best time to enjoy the autumn leaves at Lake Sagami. The mountains surrounding the lake become saturated in brilliant autumn hues during this period. Mt Arashi which is located close to Lake Sagami Park, is particularly beautiful in its autumnal form reflected from the lake's surface.
